Pennsylvania Research

MAGS members who were able to attend the Fall Conference were treated to a wealth of information on Pennsylvania research. While it is impossible to treat the entire program in the space available, some of the major points made by the speakers as well as a few other notes gleaned from various sources will be provided. Dr. Smucker provided handout which included a list of archives, etc. in southeastern Pennsylvania where the researcher might find information about religious groups. Readers will find this information reprinted with Dr. Smucker's permission on page 22.

Frances Waite, who spoke on using tax records, also provided an extensive bibliography. In addition to the tax records published in the *Pennsylvania Archives, Series 3, Volumes XI - XXII*, she recommended Helen Hutchison Woodroffe's "A Genealogist's Guide to Pennsylvania Records" published in *The Pennsylvania Genealogical Magazine, Volumes XXXI - XXXV*, for the counties of Berks, Bucks, Chester, Cumberland, Lancaster, Montgomery, Northampton, Philadelphia and York. Those researchers especially interested in Bucks County might wish to obtain *Bucks County Tax Records 1693 to 1778* (Doylestown, 1982) by Terry A. McNealy and Frances W. Waite. The Pennsylvania State Archives at Harrisburg (currently closed for repairs), the Genealogical Society of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia and the

Family History Library all have microfilmed copies of most southeastern Pennsylvania tax records.

Dr. Wokeck's talk on ship's passenger lists graphically illustrated two points that knowledgeable researchers make over and over. Points which cannot be over emphasized. It is necessary to study the history of the time in order to know what to look for and where to look. It is often possible to pick up a lost trail by studying the background of other family members, friends and neighbors. Most people do not emigrate in isolation. And, secondly, no matter how thorough and knowledgeable the translator/editor of a historical document is, he cannot bring to the work the specific knowledge of family that the individual researcher has and can and does make errors in translation/transcription: **check the original record.**

A final note on Pennsylvania research and a lead-in to our Spring Conference at Shepherdstown which will concentrate on western Pennsylvania and West Virginia research is a recent article in *Antique Week* (September 3, 1990). It seems that much of the material published in *The Horn Papers: Early Westward Movement on the Monongahela and Upper Ohio 1765-1795* by W.F. Horn (Scottsdale, Pa.: Harold Press, 1945) has been examined and found to be forged. Another reminder that just because it's in print doesn't mean its true.

Kegley Family Bible



This German Bible was printed in Philadelphia in 1830 and owned by John Kegley whose grandparents came from Annville, Lebanon County, Pennsylvania, and settled in the German community of Montgomery (now Wythe) County, Virginia, in the 1770's. According to the records of St. John's Lutheran Church, Wythe County, Virginia, John Kegley was born May 6, 1797, and died March 6, 1866, the son of Christian and Catharine Leedy Kegley. As shown below, the first wife of John Kegley was Christena Sharitz. After her death, John Kegley married Catherine Umbarger, born January 20, 1805, and died January 2, 1864, the daughter of Lenhart and Elizabeth Umbarger. John and Catherine Kegley are buried at St. John's Lutheran Church Cemetery, Wythe County, Virginia

MAGS Members' Surnames on Fraktur

Using surnames from a MAGS membership list, the following information from several fraktur may help families having the surnames, HEIN, HUBER, LEININGER, ROHRBACH, SEIBERT, SPANGLER, WITTER, and WOLF. Most fraktur are birth and baptism certificates, and most are written in German. The following are translations or, if written, in English, transcriptions:

HEIN/ROHRBACH

(Certificate written in English by scrivener, L.H. Schubert)

Certificate of Birth and Baptism, Bertha Mabel, a daughter of Oscar Irvin Hein and wife Mary Jane, daughter of J. and C. Rohrbach, was born on the 1st day of June in the year of our Lord 1886 in the Township of Maxatawny in the County of Berks in the state of Pennsylvania in North America, and was baptized on the 22nd day of August in the year of our Lord 1886 by the Reverend B. F. Krumlich. Her sponsors were Jacob Rohrbach and his wife Carolina, the grandparents.

WITTER/HUBER

(Certificate written in German) birth and Baptism Certificate.

To this legally married couple known as Leonhard Witter and his lawful wife, Elisabeth, born Huber, is born to the world a daughter the 22nd day of December in the year of our Lord 1795. This daughter was born in York County in the state of Pennsylvania in North America and was baptized and called the name of Sara by Reverend J. Herbst. [No date of baptism nor sponsors' names are given.]

SPANGLER/SEIBERT

(Certificate written in English)

Certificate of Birth and Baptism. Paul Peter Spangler, a son of Milton Spangler and wife Celeca, daughter of David Seibert, was born on the 9th day of June in the year of our Lord, 1892 in the Township of South Lebanon in the County of Lebanon in the state of Pennsylvania in North America, and was baptized on the 29th day of June in the year of our Lord 1893, by Reverend Schantz. (No sponsors' names given.)

WOLF/LEININGER

(Certificate written in German.)

Birth and Baptism Certificate. To this legally married couple known as William Wolf and his lawful wife, Ellenorah [Ellen Nora or Eleanor], born Leininger, is a son to the world born the 13th day of March in the year of our Lord 1860. This child was born in Cornwall Township in Lebanon County in the state of Pennsylvania in North America and was baptized by Pastor Augustus Wedeking [?] and called the name, William Wolf. The sponsors were the parents themselves.

NOTE: a second certificate for the same family records the birth of a son named Aaron Wolf, born April 25, 1876, in Lower Heidelberg Township, Berks County. He was baptized on June 8, 1876, by Pastor Aaron Finrock, and the sponsors were the parents.

Sparacio, Ruth and Sam Sparacio. *Virginia County Court Records: Will Abstracts of Loudoun County, Virginia, Will Book B, 9 March 1772 - 9 December 1782*. McLean, Va.: Antient Press, 1988. 131 pp.; full-name index; softcover.

Our apologies for omitting the price in our review last issue. Our recommendation stands.

Bockstruck, Lloyd DeWitt. *Virginia Colonial Soldiers*. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1988. ix, 443; full-name index; place index; hardcover.

Bockstruck has surveyed most of Virginia's early records to bring us this list of early soldiers. While this is not a definitive listing, it provides Virginia researchers with the best source to date for ancestral service in the colonial wars. The list, and the entire book is a list, is taken from names of officers taken from the individual county court minute and order books, the muster rolls of Captain Beverley Robinson raised in Virginia in 1746 for an expedition against Canada; militia lists for the French and Indian War taken from the papers of George Washington and militia lists for Dunmore's War taken from Draper's Manuscripts and records at the Virginia State Library. Additional information in regard to militia service found in the journals of the House of Burgesses, Hening's Statutes, Virginia Records in the Public Record Office in London, the Draper manuscripts, bounty land applications and warrants and court martial records is also included.

The author has gone beyond a simple listing of marriages recorded in the county clerk's office. Arranged alphabetically by last name of groom, sources include Clerk's fee books 1-4 (1761-4), minister's returns, marriage register, bonds, and parish registers including the New Jerusalem Evangelical Lutheran Church, Lovettsville, and the Fairfax Monthly Meeting. A list of ministers with the date they gave bond to perform the rite of matrimony and their church affiliation when known is found in the appendix.

Crozier, William Armstrong, editor. *Virginia County Records, Volume 1: Spotsylvania County 1721-1800*. Baltimore, Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1905. (reprinted 1990).vii, 576 pp. full-name index; hardcover.

Established in 1721 Spotsylvania reached its present size in 1734 when Orange County was created. During this thirteen year period prior to the establishment of Orange County. Spotsylvania County encompassed the counties of Orange, Culpeper, Greene, Madison, Rappahannock and all of Virginia west of the Blue Ridge. Crozier's abstracts of the county records include this period and continue to 1800. His "transcriptions [are] from the original files at the county court house of wills, deeds, administrators' and guardians' bonds, marriage licenses and lists of Revolutionary pensioners." These abstracts do not always provide all of the information to be found in a given document. For example, one such abstracted deed omits the names of the sons in a lease for lives.

Sage, Clara McCormack and Laura Sage Jones. *Early Records: Hampshire County, Virginia now West Virginia including at the start most of known Virginia aside from Augusta District*. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1939 (1969). new full-name index; 170 pp.; hardcover;

Each section of the book is arranged alphabetically. There are brief abstracts of deeds, leases, etc. arranged alphabetically by grantor followed by a grantee/grantor list. There is a partial list of Fairfax surveys and grants, copies of the 1782 and 1784 state census, a list of pensioners in 1835, marriage bonds for 1824-1828 (only records extant prior to 1866) and a "synopsis" of wills books 1-21 many of which are found only in the

original. Lists of estates (no wills recorded) found in books 1 and 2 are also included. The authors have provided a valuable service to researchers checking the Valley of Virginia for traces of their ancestors.

Baxter, Angus. *In Search of Your European Roots: A Complete Guide to Tracing Your Ancestors in Every Country in Europe*. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1985 (1988). xix, 289 pp.; index; softcover.

This is not a book on European travel or history; it is primarily a list of the types of records produced in a given country and the most likely repositories for these records. Short lessons in history are given when it is necessary to understand migration patterns, date changes, and possible sources for specific records. One is warned that German ancestry does not mean that ancestral records will necessarily be found in Germany. Many Germans settled in the Ukraine, Transylvania, Hungary, Jugoslavia, Czechoslovakia and other areas of Europe.

At the end of the section on Germany the author recommends writing to the depository in anticipation of a visit. We would do well to remember this when traveling in the States as well. Archives and libraries close temporarily and records move. Today in Europe these changes may be more dramatic than usual. However, the value of this book remains.

In addition to information on archives, the author has included lists of genealogical associations. It is obvious that a book of this size cannot give all the ins and outs of European research, but it does provide a composite overview of thirty European countries,

the records available and how to find and use them. Whether one chooses to be an armchair researcher or a traveler, this handy compendium will be of value.

Bentley, Elizabeth Petty. *County Courthouse Book*. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1990. ix, 386 pp.; softcover.

Current addresses, phone numbers and copy charges are provided. The date of origin and the parent county, territory, etc. are given. The author relied on her questionnaires for specific holdings and the information is assumed to be correct. Erroneous information creeps in when there is a misinterpretation. For example, Virginia has no separate naturalization records and most counties surveyed returned the answer, "no records." Augusta County which apparently returned an extensive explanation gave the correct answer: "must be searched for." Orange County is listed as having none, although this reviewer personally abstracted the records for 1734-1782 and these were published in *The Magazine of Virginia Genealogical Society*. Chesterfield County apparently returned no information and nothing is listed. Again this reviewer abstracted the records appearing in one order book and these were published in the *Southside Virginian*. There are other errors. Orange County marriages are listed as beginning in 1857, they actually begin almost a hundred years earlier although only a few remain prior to the Revolutionary War.

Errors aside, the value of this book lies in the current addresses and the information it does provide. We are often reminded when consulting abstracts to check the original; here, too, we need to remember this admonition. We need to use this book as a guide and not the "last word." If you

plan to do any research out of your own immediate area, you will find this book of value. One phone call to check the hours of operation or to determine if the records you seek are there or at another repository may well save you a trip and more than the price of the book.

Pedigo, Virginia G. and Lewis G. Pedigo. *History of Patrick and Henry Counties, Virginia*. Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1990 (1933). viii, 400 pp.; hardcover.

The first seventy-eight pages of this book comprise the history portion. The next 222 pages provide sketches of "Prominent Families" and the last one hundred pages lists 809 abstracts of patents and grants taken from the land books at the Virginia State Archives. These abstracts begin in 1779 and give the book and page number, the names of the grantee, the date, acreage and a brief description of the location.

While the one hundred plus family sketches are typical of the period when the book was written in that they give no documentation, they do provide a place to begin. Many give the origin of the families. Be warned that the "index" is really a four and one-half page table of contents. A full-name index would have been a real plus.

They take equal pride in what appears on the printed page. This book is no exception. Written by Hank Jones, Jr. (Those MAGS members who were lucky enough to be at the 1989 fall conference will remember him.), a Fellow of the American Society of Genealogists and winner of the Jacobus award for his book on New York Germans, this book traces 172 different German surnames of 1710 Palatine immigrants to Ireland. Many of the descendants of these German to Ireland immigrants later moved to America and Canada.

Rarely does one find such a definitive study in print. Seldom can we be sure that the research is of a quality to be trusted. Here we have both. If Jones is not sure, he tells you. While specific documentation is lacking, Jones gives the source of his information and the complete description of the source is to be found in his "Some Hints for Using this Book." Anyone with German ancestry of unknown origin and many with "Irish" ancestry would be well advised to check this book for a possible answer to their problem.

Harris, Maurine and Glen. *Concise Genealogical Dictionary*. Salt Lake City, Utah: Ancestry, Inc., 1989. xii, 259 pp.; softcover.

Have you ever: Plowed through *Black's Law Dictionary* trying to figure out what a legal term meant two hundred years ago? Wondered why only "neat" cattle were taxed? Wanted to know what kind of disease killed an ancestor who died of *cramp colic*? Wondered what *ca sa* or *LS* meant when found on a legal document? Wanted to know what your relatives were doing when they delivered *livery of seisin*? Then this is the book for you.

This is not meant to be a definitive study and it isn't. For example, the explanation of entail is

of little value; it would take pages to cover the topic. However, the authors have provided a small, easy to take with you book that gives a brief definition of many of those terms encountered in our searches and nowhere else. In addition, to the definitions there is a separate section dealing with commonly found abbreviations; however, if one is not familiar with Latin reference will often have to be made to the term itself in the first section.

While I am sure items have been omitted and some of the definitions do not cover all of the useful meanings, this is still one of those books that should be in any genealogical library.

Hoenstine, Floyd G. *Guide to Genealogical and Historical Research in Pennsylvania*. n.p.:n.p., 1978. iv, 604 pp.; last-name index; hardcover.

Pennsylvania researchers usually encounter the Hoenstine Rental Library somewhere in their search. The *Guide* is a list and brief description of the books available for rent from the Hoenstine Library. The book is an annotated bibliography of Pennsylvania research sources, but the main attraction to most researchers is that it also indexes the surnames of the families in these books. While most of the books do deal with Pennsylvania history and genealogies many do not. J.T. McAllister's *Virginia Militia and Ohio Valley in the Colonial Days* are among the entries.

The author warns that all names are not included in the index "being too numerous," and that items listed for the locality should also be searched. However, when the reference for Cumberland County was checked the note "References too numerous to include. Name found in all communities." was found. The book is not definitive; few are. It is a valuable source book

This supplement contains an additional 518 books. Like the first volume, each book description lists the localities covered. If all names are not listed in the index, this is noted in the description. In addition, personal comments such as, "nice reading," occasionally appear in brackets.

The descriptions for each book are often better than the descriptions found in the publisher's catalog and sometimes include personal comments. While the emphasis is still on Pennsylvania research, many titles of general interest are also included.

Cerny and Zimmerman continue their study of the second Germanna settlement. Like the earlier titles, each of these volumes begins with the same overview of the Germanna colonists known as the Second Germanna Colonists of 1717 and concludes with a chapter listing a "revised constituency." This revised constituency is based upon documentary evidence which is cited in the first chapter.

The authors have done extensive work in microfilmed German records and have provided 1717 descendants with answers to their German ancestry.

As the title indicates these books deal with the immigrants before they came to Germanna. No attempt has been made to carry the lineage further. The documentation is thorough and complete references are supplied.
