The Second Vice Presidents's duties include:

■ With the help and advice of the Board of Directors, plans programs for the semi-annual meetings of the society. This includes engaging speakers for the meetings, and, if necessary, making any arrangements, i.e., securing podiums, overhead projectors, etc., for the speakers.

■ With the help and advice of the Board of Directors, decides the location of the semi-annual meetings. This includes engaging the hall, making arrangements for meals and any other necessary preparations that are needed.

■ Attends board meetings.

You don't need experience for the job and the 1994 spring and fall meetings are already planned. It's not too big of a job for someone, but it's too much for someone to do as a second job. Won't someone please volunteer.

Spurred by rumors of the possibility that a number of Virginia's manuscript records including county loose papers were going to be sent to a storage facility when the new state library building is completed, a group of interested people began an investigation. Not only is the off-site storage planned, but we (your editor was one of those investigating) also discovered that the State Archives which is a part of the Virginia State Library and Archives received only 11% of the \$20.3 million dollar budget and that in the fiscal year 1992-3 only \$7000 was allocated for preservation. Of the total 106 million items stored at the Archives 100 were treated for preservation in 1991-2. Realizing that until the Archives becomes a separate institution (Virginia is one of the four states which does not have a separate archives) funding for preservation would lag behind other Library concerns, we began a campaign to institute change.

Because of its concern the Virginia Genealogical Society sponsored a resolution to create a legislative study committee to study the feasibility of creating a separate Archives.

While we were busy trying to help preserve Virginia's history others were busy too. A bill was sponsored, has passed (continued on page 47)

Fraktur Forum

It "Matter's" On Fraktur


William Casey asked about the name MATTER, among others, on fraktur. He is searching for MATTERs primarily in Dauphin County, Pennsylvania. Several fraktur from Dauphin County have this name.

A fraktur made for David MATTER, son of Michael MATTER and his wife Catharina CUPPER (COOPER), is in the collection of Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. David was born June 13, 1815, in Dauphin County, and he was baptized by Reverend SCHINDEL. Sponsors at his baptism were Michael MATTER and his wife Anna Maria.

Fraktur artist, Carl E. MÜNCH (1769-1833), made several fraktur having the name MATTER. One is in the Free Library of Philadelphia. It was made for Anna, daughter of Matthias and Catharina (MATTER) DEIBLER. Anna was born October 4, 1829, in Lykens Township, Dauphin County. She was baptized January 4, 1830, by Pastor Johann Peter SCHINDEL. Her parents were sponsors.

MÜNCH made a drawing for Balthaser MATTER in 1807. The drawing says, "Balthaser MATTER, Upper Paxton Township, Dauphin County, in the state of Pennsylvania, AD 1807." This drawing was sold at Sotheby's in New York on January 23, 1974.

Donald SHELLEY pictures a MÜNCH fraktur in his book, *The Fraktur-Writings or Illuminated Manuscripts of the Pennsylvania Germans*, published in 1960 by the Pennsylvania German Society. This fraktur was made for Anna Margareta BIEDERMANN, whose mother was Margareta MATTHER. Anna Margareta's father was Balthaser BIEDERMANN. She was born in Upper Paxton Township, Dauphin County, on March 15, 1792, and baptized by Pastor ENDERLEIN. Sponsors were Jacob HERMANN and his wife Anna Margareta,

According to other MÜNCH certificates, MATTERs sponsored baptisms for the RAMBERGER family. One of these is in the Houghton Library at Harvard University in Cambridge, Massachusetts (#56M-187PF). It was made for Jacob RAMBERGER, son of Balthaser RAMBERGER and his wife Susanna, born SEACRER. Jacob RAMBERGER was born June 19, 1806, in Upper Paxton Township, Dauphin County. He was baptized August 10 by H. KRAMER. Sponsors were Jacob MATTER and his wife Catarina. The mother's maiden name on this certificate was added later. A family historian in a related line says her maiden name was actually LEHMAN.

On January 23, 1974, Sotheby's in New York sold a related example. It was made for Anna Catarina RAMBERGER, daughter of Baltasar RAMBERGER and his wife Elisabeth, born SIRER [?]. Anna Catarina was born October 1, 1805, in Upper Paxton Township, Dauphin County, and baptized November 10 by Reverend H. KRAMER. Sponsors were Georg MATTER and his wife Anna Catarina.

Sotheby's sold another MATTER certificate at the same sale. Made by fraktur artist, Conrad TREVITZ (1750-1830), this certificate was for Elisabeth MATTER, born in Lykens Township, Dauphin County, on July 23, 1817. Elisabeth's parents were Baldaser MATTER and his wife, Maria Magdalena, born GIESSEMAN. Elisabeth MATTER was baptized by Pastor H.D. SCHINDEL. The sponsor was Christina METZ, widow of Michael METZ.

A MATTER certificate was listed in *Pennsylvania Folklife* (July 1, 1951, page 6). It says Johan Michael MATTER was born March 29, 1791, in Lykens Valley, (continued on page 36)

German Locality Index

For some time, MAGS has been using as one of its research resources a printed listing, "German Locality Index," which cross-indexes German surnames to specific locations in Germany, and gives the name and address of the person researching each surname.

This listing was compiled from submissions by members of the Chicago Genealogical Society, Die Pommerschen Leute, the German Research Association, and Palatines to America. The original listing, a paper printout made in 1987 was in location sequence only, so that finding individual surnames was very difficult.

Ed Winner has just completed keying these records into a computer database which allows us to search easily and quickly for any surname or location. There are some problems (listed below) but the GLI can be a valuable resource:

- There are some typographical errors in the files; some from the original printing and also from the new data entry. We have not been able to find and correct all of these errors.

- The file is full of duplicates: there are separate entries for every alternative spelling and every possible location for each surname being researched.

- Locations are listed as they were submitted and have not been checked against an atlas or other reference materials for accuracy.

- The original material was compiled in 1987; some of the addresses may no longer be valid.

If you wish us to research this file for you, please send your request with a SASE to Edward G. Winner, 219 Whittier St., NW, Washington, DC 20012. Specify each surname and each alternate spelling you wish reported or specify the SOUNDEX code or codes you wish reported.

MAGS members with access to a personal computer may wish to receive this data on floppy disk. To use the data easily, you will need an IBM or clone computer with a high-density 5¼" or 3½" disk drive and software. The file has been built using a standard database software package

called Professional File. The data can be converted to ASCII, dBase III or Lotus 123 format. For data on a disk, give surname specifications as above, designate the computer format preferred and include one HD (high density) disk plus \$1.50 for shipping.

Upper Paxton Township, Dauphin County. His parents were Michael MATTER and his wife Anna Maria MATTER. He was baptized April 25 by Reverend ENDERLEIN. Sponsors were John Michael ENDERLEIN and his wife Elizabeth. This certificate goes on to say John Michael MATTER married September 25, 1814. His wife's name is not given, but she died November 17, 1824. He married a second time to Rebecka KINNER on March 29, 1825. An additional death date is given. Presumably it is the death date of Johan Michael. The date is February 11, 1838, aged 46 years, 10 months, 18 days.

A Catharina MATTER, daughter of Johannes MATTER and his wife Maria (LEVAN) MATTER, was born June 19, 1798, in Maxatawny Township, Berks County. Catharina was baptized by Reverend Solomon FREDERICI (Lutheran). Sponsors at her baptism were Jacob LEVAN and his wife Maria Magdalena. The whereabouts of this certificate is unknown.

Buchbesprechungen

Books which deal with German research, source records for the Mid-Atlantic area and books of general interest to the genealogical researcher will be reviewed in the order in which they are received. Beverly Repass Hoch, CGRS *From Ziefen to Sally Run* (1993) x, 110 pp.; illus.; maps; acid-free paper; full-name index; perfect-bound; paper. For ordering information contact Jacob Repass Memorial Fund, 3912 Camino de la Sierra, NE, Albuquerque, NM 87111.

On occasion one finds a genealogy which is also a family treasure; such is this volume by Beverly Hoch. It traces the lineage of the emigrant Jacob Repass through five generations in Switzerland, concluding with his grandchildren in Wythe County, Virginia, where he moved c1790. Maps and photographs identify places of origin, homes, churches and individuals. Original documents and signatures as well as Bible records and a songbook, whose serendipitous appearance provided the information needed to trace the family to Switzerland, are reproduced. Extensive documentation and a bibliography lists sources, some of which this student of southwestern Virginia research was unaware. Those planning to produce their own family genealogy may well wish to peruse the pages of this volume for ideas and format. Those searching for the wayward emigrant may also learn. For all, this book is an enjoyable experience and a lesson in how to create a family treasure.

Elaine Obbink Zimmerman and Kenneth Edwin Zimmerman, *Records of St. Paul's Cemetery 1855-1946* (1992) notes; index; soft-cover; \$9.50 ppd., inc. tax. Order from Elaine Zimmerman, PO Box 276, Woodstock, MD 21163.

The book is a transcription of the original cemetery register rearranged in burial lot order. There are 84 pages of names, about 2000 names in all plus an index and a history of the cemetery. The

original St. Paul's cemetery register is in sequence order by death date and burial date. The first entries are transfers from the old cemetery owned by the Second German Evangelical Lutheran Church. Records prior to 1891 were written in old German script. St. Paul's Lutheran cemetery sits atop a knoll in Druid Hill Park in Baltimore City, Maryland, and many German immigrants and their descendants are buried there. The cemetery predates the park and is one of three cemeteries there. The cemetery was once jointly owned by three German Lutheran Churches: Emmanuel Lutheran, St. Paul's, and Martini Lutheran of South Baltimore.

The book is of special value because some of the stones have been destroyed, not only by time, but vandalism in 1986. Since then the cemetery has been restored and is currently owned and maintained by Martini Evangelical Lutheran Church. Dick Bush

Don Heinrich Tolzmann, *Upper Midwest German Biographical Index* (1993) xi, 125 pp.; full-name index; softcover; \$23.00. Order from Heritage Books, Inc., 1540-E Pointer Ridge Place, Ste. 300, Bowie, MD 20716.

Many early histories, biographies and other sources had inadequate or non-existent indexes. Attempts to find information buried in these volumes are often unsuccessful. The cost of reissuance with new indexes is prohibitive. Hence compilations such as this, which serves as an index to twenty-two volumes of German sources, are always welcome. Over 6000 names are listed, offering to many a first chance at new and perhaps exciting information. The focus is the upper Midwest: Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin.

both houses and is currently awaiting the governor's signature. The word Archives is to be removed from the name The Virginia State Library and Archives. The institution will become the Library of Virginia. And, the Archives will become even more of a step-child.

The Study Committee needs to know that we are concerned about the preservation of Virginia's history and that we are adamantly opposed to moving priceless documents to off-site storage where they will lie unrestored until they disintegrate.
