MAGS INCORPORATING

Sending Checks in Marks to Germany

(1) International Money Orders. Marks can be sent using the U.S. Postal Service. Fee: \$8.75. A voucher must be ordered through USPS and it takes about three weeks to receive it. (2) Ruesch International increased their rate to \$15. (3) International Currency Express (ICE). A draft for DM 30 was ordered which is equivalent to \$17.81, based on the ICE quoted exchange rate. Service fee: \$5.00. This was charged to my credit card and two days later the draft was received, ready to send to Germany. A personal check can also be written, saving a few pennies, but the turnaround time is greater due to use of mail service. The payee (in Germany) reported that the check was written on Dresdner Bank (a major German bank) and that the check is a *Verrechnungsscheck*, which means the payee must deposit it in his bank account. The payee was charged DM 0.60 to deposit the check – the minimum charge for any

transaction at his bank. (In Germany, banks charge fees for deposits, withdrawals, check cashing, and just about any other activity.)

FRAKTUR FORUM

FEITNER on Fraktur

Robert Vivian asked about the name FEITNER on fraktur. Some years ago, another correspondent asked about this name. In both cases, their ancestors appear to have moved from southeast Pennsylvania early in the 1800s if not sooner – to Ohio in once instance and New York in the other instance. As often mentioned in this column, most fraktur were made in southeast Pennsylvania, and most were birth and baptism certificates, often referred to as *Taufscheine*. *Taufscheine* became so popular in southeast Pennsylvania, they were printed so that fraktur artists and scribes could keep up with demand. Many were printed outside Pennsylvania in areas having large German populations, such as the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia, western Maryland, St. Louis in Missouri (c. 1850-1900), throughout Ohio (c. 1817-1900), and in New York. The fact that printers in these areas printed *Taufscheine* suggests they found a healthy local market. Many also marketed printed forms in southeast Pennsylvania where the market was always strong. For example, St. Louis and New York printers, as well as those in Ohio, marketed prints in Pennsylvania.

Of the 20,000 or more fraktur we have recorded and indexed, a relatively small percentage has infill (genealogy data) from outside southeast Pennsylvania. They undoubtedly exist, but no one has thoroughly surveyed examples beyond Pennsylvania. There are a few exceptions to this. Beverly Repass Hoch, one of the founding members of MAGS, is currently surveying fraktur made for southwest Virginia families, especially those from Wythe County. If you know of fraktur that would help her in her research, she would like to hear from you. She can be reached at P.O. Box 505, Wytheville, VA 24382. Also, Gene Comstock is surveying southern fraktur. His survey includes Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia, and the Carolinas. Gene can be reached at 242 Merrifield Ln., Winchester, VA 22602. And June Lloyd, Librarian at the York County Heritage Trust, is including Maryland examples in her survey of fraktur from York County, Pennsylvania. June can be reached by writing her at 250 E. Market St., York, PA 17403.

To my knowledge, no one is canvassing Ohio for fraktur from that state. Yet, Ohio is probably a state that is relatively fraktur-rich. Ohio had an early fraktur tradition dating from about 1800 to 1900. Just this year, on January 8, 2000, Garth's Auctions in Delaware, Ohio, sold a freehand fraktur from Ohio made in 1808. Virtually nothing has been done to canvas fraktur made in New York and Missouri. Yet many examples of fraktur would probably become known from all these areas if someone would search for them.

I found only one fraktur that might help Robert Vivian. It is an early example made in Pennsylvania by Daniel Schumacher, who baptized Johannes FEITNER on June 3, 1770. Johannes was born April 19, 1770. His parents were Christopher and Barbara Maria FEITNER. Schumacher noted Christopher was deacon of the Lutheran congregation in Lehigh County. Sponsors at Johannes's baptism were Johann Dewald HERTZOG and Catharina WANNEMACHER, both single. It is not known if this fraktur survives. It is listed in Daniel Schumacher's baptism register, which was translated by Frederick Weiser and published in 1968 by The Pennsylvania German Society.

I will continue to watch for FEITNERS on fraktur for Robert Vivian. If you have names you wish me to research on fraktur, send a self-addressed, stamped envelope to Corinne Earnest, P.O. Box 1007, East Berlin, PA 17316.

LONGENECKER RESEARCH

The Longenecker Family Newsletter deals with the genealogy of the three different Longenecker families in the Philadelphia area in the early 1700's. One was the descendants and ancestors of Ulrich in Chester County, Pa., emigrated before 1718, died about February, 1757, and had a wife named Elizabeth. A second was the descendants and ancestors of Woolrick in Lancaster County, Pa., emigrated on the ship Hope in 1733, died in early 1752, and had a wife named Anna (nee: Blaser). A third was the descendants and ancestors of Anders Petersson in Kingsessing Township, Philadelphia County, Pa., whose name was changed by his own accord about 1693 to Longacre (various spellings), perhaps to distinguish himself from Anders Petersson of Cecil County, MD (born about 1659, son of Peter Månsson). Ander's descendent was Sarah Longacre, pictured as a little girl on the Indian Head penny. This twenty-first Accession List opens the new millennium with great hopes for the LENDING LIBRARY. 



