MAGS CELEBRATES 20 YEARS WITH AN ARRAY OF PROGRAMS

This year, Mid-Atlantic Germanic Society celebrates twenty years of continued service to family historians with an interest in their Germanic "roots." The official celebration will be held October 18, 2002 in Columbia, Maryland at a twentieth anniversary banquet. Nationally-known speaker Dr. George Schweitzer will give a presentation in costume, titled *Was Your Ancestor A Wine-Drinking, A Beer-Drinking or Schnapps Drinking German?*

Opportunities for MAGS members to commemorate this important benchmark are not limited to October 18th. At the Spring meeting on April 27th, two speakers will cover German research in some depth. Dr. Helmut Schmahl is a member of the History Department of Johannes Gutenberg University in Mainz, Germany and he is a professional genealogist. Professor Schmahl will start off with a presentation titled *An Introduction to Family Research in the Palatinate*. The presentation that follows will introduce a record source or depository that may be new to most MAGS members—the *Archive at the Rathaus*. Dr. Schmahl will conclude with a presentation titled *Finding Birth Places of German Immigrants*.

Genealogists researching German ancestors in the Washington-Baltimore area are rather fortunate in that they live close to a library that has an untold quantity of materials published in Germany. At the Spring meeting Dan Heinemeier will explore two of those sources that can be found at the Library of Congress—*ortssippenbuchern* and local German histories.

The celebration continues on October 19, 2002, when MAGS will hold a joint conference with the National Genealogical Society in Columbia, Maryland. MAGS members will have to make some tough choices on that day, as they will have an opportunity to listen to eight presentations. In four presentations, Cyndi Howells Webmaster of *Cyndi's List*, will show us how to make better use of online research opportunities. NGS Board member Sheila Benedict, a Certified Genealogical Records Specialist, will give presentations on *The Importance of Collateral Research, Maps, County Histories and City Directories, Newspaper Research and Collecting, Recording and Evaluating Data*.

Mark your calendars now and plan on attending this year's array of exciting events!

Ahnentafel is a German word that translates roughly as "Table of Ancestors." An *Ahnentafel* starts with a single individual and systematically lists basic genealogical data about that individual, his parents, grandparents, and so forth. Some *Ahnentafels* go back 12 generations and more! MAGS's *Ahnentafel* project aims to collect German-American *Ahnentafels* and publish them as a genealogical research aid.

Volume I contains over 1200 surnames in 29 *Ahnentafels*. It is indexed and contains a basic map of Germany. FRAKTUR FORUM

HOCH on Fraktur

One of the charter members of MAGS, Beverly Repass Hoch, once asked if I had ever come across a fraktur having the names HOCH and FRANZ. In Volume II of *The Printed Birth and Baptismal Certificates of the German Americans*, Klaus Stopp illustrates a taufschein (birth and baptism certificate) made for Maria Ana HOCH, whose parents were Heinrich and Margaretha (FRANTZ) HOCH. According to this certificate, Maria Ana HOCH was born about seven o'clock in the morning on July 23, 1819 in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. She was baptized in Moore Township, also in Northampton County, on October 23, 1819 by Pastor MENDSEN, Lutheran. Sponsors were Jacob and Ana HOCH. What appears to be a date of marriage is noted on this certificate. The date is September 27, 1840.

Over one hundred fraktur having the name HOCH are known. I will list information from a few early examples. In Volume I of *The Printed Birth and Baptismal Certificates of the German Americans*, Stopp pictures a taufschein made for Anna Maria HOOCK, who was born September 18, 1782 in Hanover [York County], Pennsylvania. Her parents were Henrich and Hanna HOOCK. Anna Maria was baptized January 1, 1783 by Pastor COBRECHT [GOBRECHT]. Sponsors at her baptism were Conrad and Clara SCHWAB. Stopp's monumental, six-volume study of American fraktur-related birth and baptism certificates is available through the MAGS Lending Library.

Early fraktur bookplates (showing book ownership) have the name HOCH. As beautiful as many are, most bookplates are disappointing in terms of genealogy. For example, Dr. Donald A. Shelley pictures examples in his classic study, *The Fraktur-Writings or Illuminated Manuscripts of the Pennsylvania Germans*. One bookplate he pictures was made on December 27, 1807 for Anna HOCH, but no other information is given. Some bookplates offer a few more details. For example, the Library Company of Philadelphia has a bookplate that was made on December 26, 1803 for Ester HOCH. This example gives a location saying Ester HOCH was in Hereford Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. In *Ontario Fraktur*, Michael Bird pictures a bookplate made for Abraham HOCH on February 20, 1786. It says Abraham HOCH was a writing student at Perkasio, which is in Bucks County, Pennsylvania.

An interesting piece called a "Sad Song" recently became known. It gives information about the death of Isai HOCHIN, son of Daniel and Margaretha HOCHIN. The family surname might have been HOCH. This German-language piece is a "broadside" that is in the Haydn Foundation for Cultural Arts in New York. Broadside are single-sheet prints, printed on one side only. They are precursors to newspapers, but are even made today as posters and announcements meant for display. While broadside-type elegies are well-known in New England, they are less common among Pennsylvania Germans. Pennsylvania Germans had a wonderful tradition for making broadsides, but elegies simply were not popular among Germans in America. This example, however, says little Isai HOCHIN died on May 25, 1856 at age 8 years, 7 months, and 25 days. This information is then followed by a 14-verse poem.

As is typical in fraktur, most examples having the name HOCH are taufscheins or family registers found in Bibles. These types of fraktur yield far more family history than most other types of fraktur.

Mid-Atlantic Germanic Society

Celebrating 2 Decades of Service to German-American Genealogy

Year 2002 marks the 20th anniversary of the formation of the Mid-Atlantic Germanic Society. In the September 1982 issue of *Der Kurier* (Volume 1, Number 1), Acting President Norman C. Emerick writes that MAGS was formed at a meeting on July 10, 1982. Present were Anne Tenny, Deborah Showalter, Ralph Knisely, Ardyce Harrison, Marta Coffman, Beverly Hoch, Doris Suresch, and Norman C. Emerick. Dues for the first year were set at \$5.00 individual or \$7.00 family. Initial membership was drawn from members of Palatines to America residing in the mid-Atlantic region.

The first issue of *Der Kurier* announced that MAGS would "... be concerned with emigration from Germany, emigration patterns within the Mid-Atlantic area, ancestor charts, surname indexes, special research areas, as well as any subject or theme which has value for a significant group of members." Plans for a quarterly newsletter/journal (*Der Kurier*), a Queries section, and annual Spring and Fall meetings were also announced.

MAG's first general meeting was reported in the November 1982 issue (Vol 1, No 2) of *Der Kurier*:

The first annual Fall meeting was held at the Dan-Dee Inn outside Frederick, Maryland on September 25. After opening remarks by Acting President, Norman Emerick, the first speaker of the day, Calvin E. Schildknecht told of the origins of various German surnames and traced them after immigrants arrived in this country, citing irregular spellings and pronunciations.

Mary Keysor Meyer spoke in the afternoon, on her recent publication with P. William Filby of the three-volume *Passenger and Immigration Lists Index*. Mrs. Meyer recalled the detail that went into the search and compilation of more than 300,000 names in the index. The three-volume set identifies immigrants arriving in the United States between 1600 and 1900.

Also present at the meeting were a professional photographer, who took orders to reproduce old photos, and a professional broadcast technician, who recorded the speakers. A silent auction produced competitive bidding for the many services and books offered. Members could also do rubbings of old tombstones. About forty members and their guests attended the meeting.

The annual Spring and Fall meetings remain key elements of MAGS's activities. Plans for the 2002 Spring and Fall meetings are summarized by MAGS President John Humphrey on the front cover of this issue. Of special note is the 20th anniversary banquet to be held October 18 in conjunction with the Fall Meeting.

BUCHBESPRECHUNGEN

Researching in Germany A Handbook for Your Visit to the Homeland of Your Ancestors

The subtitle of this book states that it is a "*Handbook for Your Visit to the Homeland of Your Ancestor.*" To this end the authors, both experienced researchers, discuss almost every conceivable aspect of genealogical research in Germany. They deal with this in three parts. The first chapter discusses preparation for the trip. Items discussed are objectives of the trip, preparatory correspondence, planning the trip, etc. The authors emphasize that this phase of the trip is frequently not given sufficient attention and could result in disappointments. The second chapter deals with the every day details of living abroad: lodging and restaurants, airports procedures, customs, taxes, rental cars, public transportation, telecommunications, etc. An interesting feature in this chapter is the inclusion of "topical vocabularies" giving key words and phrases you would need in given situations, i.e., a restaurant, train station, etc.

The third chapter goes into detail on civil and church repositories as well as private holdings. This chapter also includes a section on research in other German speaking countries and regions: Austria, Switzerland, Bohemia and Moravia of the Czech Republic, Alsace-Lorraine, etc. The book concludes with a short chapter on "enjoying yourself in the land of your ancestors"—sightseeing and shopping.

There is an extensive appendix which includes a vocabulary of both English-German and German-English words and phrases, a vital records vocabulary, a short course on the German script used in

genealogical records, and a rather extensive section on how to write letters to Germany. In addition to the index there is an annotated bibliography listing and describing a number of general references on German genealogy.

It is difficult to imagine potential problems or available opportunities that this book does not address. It should be an invaluable aid to a person traveling and researching in Germany. Although published in 2001 it does address how to deal with the conversion to the Euro on January 1, 2002.

Duke of York Record 1646-1679 – Original Land Titles in Delaware

This volume is an absolutely marvelous addition to our body of original records being printed and distributed to researchers and historians. Originally published in 500 copies, it is as nearly complete a transcript of the first 1000 grants of land in Delaware as is possible or reasonable. It preserves the original pagination and indicates precisely where damage renders the record unusable. Those deeds recorded in Dutch are presented only in their English translations with plats and diagrams included. The index is by first letter only but would have been improved if it had been expanded to include all names and places mentioned in the body of the deed.

Most of the deeds were issued to English or Dutch names. The few names that could be German are hard to distinguish as they could be corrupted into Dutch. Anyone whose research takes them back to early Delaware should refer to this volume.

**Fisher & Beckwith Families
of Montgomery County, Maryland**

Book Twenty-One in a series of books called *Our Maryland Heritage*, by William Neal Hurley, Jr., includes information about the Fisher and Beckwith families of Montgomery County, Maryland. This book begins with the ancestry and descendants of William Thomas Fisher, born about 1819, and his wife, Eliza Ellen Beckwith, born about 1820.

Hurley was unable to make a clear connection to the European origins of William Thomas Fisher and Eliza Ellen Beckwith. However, some of the Fishers he found in Frederick County, Maryland, may have been of German origin. For example, Hurley documents information about Adam Fisher/Fischer (1736-87), whose Revolutionary War service records suggest he was a graduate of "a German University." Also, a Henry Fischer (born c. 1800) was born in Germany as was his wife Christena, born about 1809. They settled in Fredericktown and were there in 1850 when the census was taken. Other German names that appear in *Fisher & Beckwith Families* include Hoover, Sheets, Baughman, Hershey, and Koenig.

Hurley uses census records, marriage records, wills, estate papers, and numerous other records to document his narrative about these families. As with other books in this series, Hurley includes a bibliography and an everyname index.

Hurley's series of *Our Maryland Heritage* include books on *The Stottlemeyer Families*, *the Fry Families*, *the Soper Families*, *The Bowman and Gue Families*, *the King Families*, and *The Brandenburg Families*. For more about this series, contact Heritage Books at the address above.

**Guns on the Chesapeake – The
Winning of America's Independence**

Guns on the Chesapeake is not a book to be used for genealogical purposes but do not let this deter you from reading it. The subject matter deals with America's fight for independence along and within the Chesapeake Bay region. Mr. Williamson writes of the different battles that take place along the waterways leading to and around the bay but he does not bore the reader with great amounts of detail relating to each.

There are a few mentions of interest to someone of German descent such as the purchase of German soldiers from Hesse as we all know the Hessians. This is also mentioned once again on page 72. Mr. Williamson also very briefly mentions German immigration along with the Scotch, Irish, French, Swedes, and Poles on page 23. The last mention to do with Germans in general is on page 150 when Maryland opened the voting booth to both Germans and Roman Catholics in 1776.

Guns on the Chesapeake does not strictly stay with the Chesapeake Bay region. The author does fill the reader in with some details as to what is taking place in Philadelphia, New Jersey, New York, and Boston. This book is worth the reader's time because so much has been written about what happened with battles and such in the northern part of the country.

Guns on the Chesapeake is indexed and it also contains a bibliography. Surnames are included in the index but the majority are of already well-known players of the American Revolution on both the American and British side.
