Gleaning facts about ancestors from historical German legal notices

In a previous article I mentioned that Google Books has digitized 19th century German newspapers containing legal notices into fully searchable files that can be automatically translated to some extent.

By entering an ancestor's name or the name of their village you might discover interesting facts about them that you cannot easily find elsewhere. This article will present another example of information discovered in these notices. Using two legal notices published four years apart I will show how the facts found in them can supplement existing knowledge about an immigrant family.

By searching on books.google.com for the terms "Intelligenzblatt Herschberg" I got results that included several names of interest in that village, including Gebhard Faul and his wife Margaretha Volz. I will present some facts I already knew about their lives and then show what I gleaned from the articles.

Heinrich Gebhard Faul was born in 1784¹ in the village of Ruhbank, on the southeastern outskirts of Pirmasens in the Rheinland-Pfalz. His wife, Margaretha Volz, was born in Herschberg in the same year². That village is located about 12 miles northwest of Pirmasens. I have not discovered the date and place of their marriage, but it was probably in the early 1800s.

When this couple immigrated to the United States in 1824 they brought six children with them³. The eldest two children were baptized in 1815 and 1816 in Lemberg⁴, a village a few miles east of Ruhbank. The three youngest children were baptized in Herschberg between 1819 and 1823⁵. Gebhard Faul first appeared in the Herschberg church records as a baptism sponsor in 1817. From the evidence in these articles it appears that the couple lived in the Ruhbank area until about 1817 when they moved to Herschberg.

The 14 December 1819 (No. 94) issue of *Intelligenzblatt des RheinKrieses (Advertiser of the [Bavarian] District of the Rhein*⁶) announced property near the city of Pirmasens to be auctioned to satisfy a mortgage. The notice described a farm at Ruhbankerhof and several nearby parcels of land. It appears that Gebhard held the mortgage on the property and was auctioning it because the resident farmer could not satisfy the mortgage. Gebhard and his wife were described as residents of Herschberg. Could this property have been Gebhard's family home, and were they living here before moving to Herschberg?

Each parcel of land to be auctioned was described by a section and number, with a descriptive location and the type of land – such as arable, garden, or meadow. Many of the named locations can be found on a modern map, such as Google Maps. The Horbacher, Gutenbach, Bitschacker, and steinigten Biel (Bühl) names can be found in or near the village of Ruhbank. My favorite location is described as "auf der windig Höh" – on the windy height. Google Maps shows it as a winding road leading to a higher piece of ground.

The size of each parcel was described using the terms *Morgen*, *Viertel*, and *Ruthen*. A Ruthen was somewhat equivalent to an English rod – a basic unit of land measurement equivalent to about 2.9 meters. For measuring land area it would represent a square rod. A Viertel was 10 x 10 Ruthen and a Morgen 20 x 20 Ruthen. A Morgen was traditionally the amount of land that a farmer

could plow in one morning, although the size varied between ½ acre and 2 ½ acres across Germany. The parcels described in this notice ranged from several Ruthen to 5 Morgen.




Figure 1 - Comparison of land measurement terms

A portion of the list is reproduced in Figure 2. It shows a few of the descriptive property names and sizes. Although the article does not contain a wealth of personal names, it does provide a perspective of the size and variety of land that a farmer might own in the early 1800s. It also provides proof that a person (Gebhard Faul) was in a particular place at a specific time.

The announcement of a foreclosure sale for property in the village of Herschberg owned by Gebhard and Margaretha Faul was published on 11 July 1823 (No. 218)⁷. It described 12 parcels of

land by section and number, location, size, and type of land. The owners of land on both sides of the parcel were noted, clearly identifying many residents of the village. Finally, a starting bid was given, which was 1 Gulden for most of the parcels. This article also described the size of parcels using the term *Aren*, in addition to the measurements described above. An Are (plural Aren) was 10 x 10 meters.

The names of more than 20 residents of Herschberg were mentioned in this article. While none were my ancestors, all of the names were familiar to me, since I have conducted extensive research in Herschberg. Many of these people immigrated to the United States after 1830. This article establishes them in Herschberg shortly before their immigration.

Figure 3 shows one example of a parcel description from this article. Each of the 12 descriptions mentioned one or two landowners next to the parcel property.

The final parcel, shown in Figure 4, described a 2-story house, barn, stalls, and farmyard in the village of Herschberg on the main street (Hauptstraße). Adam Stoffel lived on one side and on the other side was the Jewish congregation (Judengemeinde). The amount of land was 17 ½ Ruthen and the opening bid was 100 Gulden. The sum of the opening bids for all parcels was 111 Gulden.

Unfortunately, the article does not offer any indication of what precipitated the foreclosure on the property. It obviously caused the Faul family to leave the country for the United States. They arrived in New York City on 23 September 1824 aboard the Brig George. They settled in Franklin Township, York County, PA. Gebhard and Margaretha were enumerated there in every federal census between 1830 and 1860⁸. They both died before 1870 and were buried at St. John's (Franklin) Lutheran Church Cemetery⁹. Their children married and remained in that area.

These notices published in the *Intelligenzblatt* supplied some additional interesting facts about the lives of Gebhard Faul and his wife before they immigrated. I learned precisely where they lived in Germany and what property they owned. Fully searchable images of the *Intelligenzblatt* can be found on Google Books at <http://books.google.com>. To see the specific articles above, enter the search term (quotes included) "Gebhard Faul" for the first article and "Gebhardt Faul" for the second. Whether an article is specifically about your ancestor, or the ancestor was merely mentioned, the details can give you a greater appreciation of how they lived and the challenges they faced. American sources do not offer the same perspective.

FRAKTUR FORUM

Gross family documents run gamut of collections

Suzanne Gross asked about the name GROSS on fraktur. As is typical in my articles, names of individuals listed below are spelled as they appear on the fraktur. Unless otherwise stated, all locations are in Pennsylvania where most fraktur were made.

As many readers know, most fraktur are Taufscheine (birth and baptism certificates). A Taufschein (singular form of Taufscheine) made for Samuel Adam GROSS, son of Abraham and Elisabeth (HEFFELFINGER) GROSS, is in a private collection. This certificate says Samuel Adam was born July 19, 1843 in Moore Township, Northampton County. Samuel Adam was baptized by Pastor BECKER on August 11, 1843. The parents sponsored his baptism.

In the first volume of *The Printed Birth and Baptismal Certificates of the German Americans*, Klaus Stopp lists data from a Taufschein made for Elmira Elizabeth GROSS, daughter of Friedrich and Levina (LERCH) GROSS. Elmira Elizabeth was born March 21, 1845 in Bethlehem Township, Northampton County. She was baptized by Pastor BECKER in 1846. The parents sponsored Elmira Elizabeth's baptism.

The American Antiquarian Society in Worcester, Massachusetts, has a Taufschein made for Cornelia Lucinda CLEWELL, daughter of David and Hanna (GROSS) CLEWELL. Cornelia Lucinda was born November 18, 1823 in Bethlehem Township, Northampton County. She was baptized January 12, 1824 by C.F. SEIDEL. The sponsors at

Cornelia Lucinda's baptism were Owen and Carolina RICE.

A Taufschein was made for Johannes GROSS, son of Johan Georg and Elisabetha (FABER) GROSS. Johannes was born about four o'clock in the afternoon on Sunday, July 21, 1793 in Hanover Township, Dauphin County. He was baptized in 1793, but additional information concerning his baptism is illegible. The current location of this certificate is unknown.

In her database of York and Adams Counties fraktur, June Burk Lloyd lists several fraktur that have the name, GROSS.* Some were made for the children of Samuel and Susanna (SCHMEISSER) GROSS of Dover Township, York County. One of their daughters was Louisa GROSS, who was born March 1, 1834. She was baptized June 30, 1834, but no other information concerning her baptism is available.

Another daughter was Maria Anna GROSS, who was born January 31, 1849 and baptized June 9, 1849 by Pastor DEININGER, Lutheran. The parents sponsored Maria Anna's baptism.

Two sons of Samuel and Susanna (SCHMEISSER) GROSS are in the database. They were Georg Waschington GROSS, born November 6, 1841 in Dover Township. He was baptized by Pastor DEININGER on February 12, 1842. The other was Jacob Matheias, born January 19, 1844 in Dover Township and baptized by Pastor DEININGER on May 17,

1844. According to these Taufscheine, Susanna SCHMEISSER's father was Jacob SCHMEISSER.

Other Taufscheine listed in Lloyd's database include one made for Caroline, daughter of Samuel M. and Elizabeth (SHETTEL) GROSS. Caroline GROSS was born in West Manchester Township, York County, on May 19, 1846. She was baptized by William GERMAN, Lutheran, in 1846. Caroline's parents sponsored her baptism.

Still another recorded by Lloyd was made for Maria GROSS, daughter of Andreas and Elisabeth (SEIFERT) GROSS. Maria was born in Dover Township, York County, on December 7, 1829. She was baptized in April of 1830, but no other information concerning her baptism is available.

The Mennonite Heritage Center in Harleysville owns a bookplate that was recorded in a New Testament by fraktur artist, Jacob GROSS (1807-1900). Jacob GROSS signed and dated the bookplate January 29, 1892. He made it on his 85th birthday for Daniel GEHMAN. The New Testament was given to Daniel GEHMAN by his grandfather, Johannes GROSS.

Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster owns a Taufschein that mentions Joseph and Catharina GROS as sponsors at the baptism of Abraham JACOB Jr., who was born on January 1, 1822 in North Whitehall Township, Lehigh County. He was baptized January 20, 1822 by Pastor WARTMANN. Abraham's parents were Abraham and Elisabeth (PETER) JACOB.

On May 11, 1991, Horst Auctions in Ephrata sold a Taufschein made for Carl KLEIN, son of Jacob and Susanna (GROTZ) KLEIN. Carl KLEIN was born about three o'clock in the afternoon on October 14, 1810. He was born in Lowhill Township, Northampton [today's Lehigh] County, and baptized November 4, 1810 by Pastor GEISSINGER. The

sponsors at Carl's baptism were Daniel and Catharina SCHMID.

On September 15, 2001, Pook & Pook Auctions in Downingtown sold a Taufschein made for Catharina GROTZ, who was born July 6, 1811 in Forks Township, Northampton County. She was the daughter of Georg and Maria (STECHE) GROTZ. Catharina was baptized January 15, 1814 by Pastor ENDRES. The parents sponsored Catharina's baptism.

The location is unknown of a Taufschein made for Johannes, son of Rudolf and Anamaria (GROSZ) SCHOCH. Johannes SCHOCH was born April 19, 1792 in Richland Township, Bucks County. He was baptized by Pastor HECHT, but no date of baptism was recorded. The sponsors at Johannes's baptism were Jacob and Margaretha SCHOCH. Added notes on this certificate say that Johannes SCHOCH was confirmed March 31, 1809 and he married March 23, 1817 (no spouse's name given).

A Taufschein in a private collection was made for Mary Elizabeth GROSS, daughter of John and Elizabeth (SHEFFER) GROSS. Mary Elizabeth was born August 1, 1841 in Berkeley County, Virginia [today's West Virginia]. She was baptized by Robert DUGLAS [DOUGLAS], but no date of baptism was given. Her parents sponsored the baptism. According to this certificate, Elizabeth SHEFFER was the daughter of John SHEFFER.

As customary, I sent Suzanne Gross additional information.

If you have names you want me to research on fraktur, send a self-addressed stamped envelope to Corinne Earnest, PO Box 1132, Clayton DE 19938. There is no charge for members of the Mid-Atlantic Germanic Society. However, I receive many requests, so please be patient for a reply.

FAMILY REGISTERS

Bible contains Kohler data

On November 12, 2011, Pook & Pook Auctions in Downingtown, Pennsylvania, sold a German-language Bible printed by Kimber and Sharpless in Philadelphia. A family register was penned between the Old and New Testaments.

The register was made for Heinrich Adam F. KOHLER and his wife, Susanna (DeTURCK) KOHLER. The family register was started by Martin Wetzler (active circa 1854-88), who dated it January 6, 1865. Entries penned after 1871 are attributed to scrivener, Justus Epstein (1838-circa 1910). The deaths were recorded by Epstein and scrivener, J. George E. Franck (active circa 1878-1912).

According to the register, Heinrich Adam F. KOHLER was born December 22, 1830 in Greenwich Township, Berks County, Pennsylvania. Susanna DeTURCK, whose maiden name was also spelled DeDURCK and DeTURK in this record, was born September 25, 1832 in Oley Township, Berks County. Heinrich Adam and Susanna (DeTURCK) KOHLER married February 28, 1863. They were married by A. Gustaph HINTERLEITNER.

The children of Heinrich Adam and Susanna KOHLER were all born in Maxatawny Township, Berks County. They were:

Sarah Ann KOHLER, born June 3, 1864.

Adam David KOHLER, born November 18, 1865.

John Louis KOHLER, born April 2, 1867.

Charles Amos KOHLER, born March 21, 1868.

Susanna Elizabeth KOHLER, born April 2, 1870.

Emma Carolina KOHLER, born May 27, 1871.

Moses D. KOHLER, born October 29, 1872; baptized March 3, 1873 by Pastor SPEAKER.

Allice Elise KOHLER, born July 10, 1874; baptized by J.J. CRESSMAN.

Elmar H. KOHLER, born November 1, 1875; baptized by J.J. CRESSMAN.

Deaths were recorded as follows:

Moses D. KOHLER died March 3, 1873 at the age of 5 months and 5 days.

Susanna (DeTURK) KOHLER (the mother) died about 6:30 in the morning on May 14, 1894 at the age of 61 years, 7 months, and 19 days.

Henry Adam KOHLER (the father) died about 2:30 in the afternoon on October 8, 1900 at the age of 69 years, 9 months, and 16 days.

Mathias Münch/Minnick (1776-1860) of Rockingham County, Virginia Ancestors and Descendants

MAGS member William Brooke Fetters latest work is based on his wife's ancestry, namely Mathias Münch/Minnick of Rockingham County, Virginia. I will admit that I did not read Mr. Fetters book solely because it has no bearing on my family however if you have any Münches or Minnick's in your line you need to borrow Mr. Fetters book from the MAGS library or better yet purchase a copy of his publication.

Mr. Fetter's latest publication is based on his wife's ancestry and in his introduction he describes the thrill Mrs. Fetter received when her cousin showed them an heirloom in the farmhouse's attic. "It was the wooden chest that Grandmother Mary Ellen's maternal

grandmother had brought to America from Germany!"

In his introduction, Mr. Fetter describes the generation numbers and how they are assigned, citations and how used and the organization of his book. He has also included many maps, photographs and records of interest to descendants of Mathias.

There are three appendixes in the book that deal with the ancestors of Maria Magdalena (Wagner) Münch (appendix A), Margaret (Crist) Minnick (appendix B) and Mary Ellen (Everline) Minnick (Appendix C).
